The foundation thrives on donations from people who care. Donations are eligible for exemption under Section 80G of the Income Tax Act. Donations received in the trust are utilized for treating the underprivileged and for conducting the outreach programs. We remain indebted to our patients, bystanders and well-wishers whose donations to the SSM Trust immensely helped the trust to effectively conduct the community outreach programs.

The trust was constituted with the following objective of serving the less privileged members of our society, viz.

- Cataract surgery with intra-ocular lens implantation for people below poverty line.
- Outreach programmes in rural areas to create awareness about common eye diseases leading to blindness-Cataract, Diabetic Retinopathy and Glaucoma.
- School screening programme for testing vision in primary school children.
- Diabetic Retinopathy awareness and screening camps.
- Support charitable eye clinics.
- Establishment of a centre for rehabilitation of the visually handicapped.
- Providing fully-equipped mobile eye unit for villages and remote areas for comprehensive eye examinations.

Towards this end, its founders launched several outreach and in-house programmes in association with various NGOs under SSM Eye Research Foundation through Giridhar Eye Institute, all of them free of cost.

#### **Details of Main Outreach Programs held in 2016**

1. On 6<sup>th</sup> February 2016, Giridhar Eye Institute and SSM Eye Research Foundation jointly conducted an eye screening program in association with "Vayomithram", a Kerala Government initiative for old aged people. 110 senior citizens were screened and 77 were referred to base hospital for further check-up and management. After detailed check-up 11 patients underwent cataract surgery with IOL at free of cost.



2. The 2<sup>nd</sup> screening program of "Vayomithram" was held on 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2016 at Ponekkara. 33 senior citizens were screened at this camp and 21 were referred for detailed check-up. 6 persons were benefitted from this camp with cataract surgery with IOL at free of cost.

3. Started a Diabetic Retinopathy screening program on 1<sup>st</sup> July 2016 for working class people at their workplace. A non-mydriatic fundus camera is used for screening the staff which involves no dilatation which is inevitable for a retinopathy check-up. Staff can continue their routine job immediately after the screening. The first such screening was held at Malayala Manorama Ernakulam unit. The team screened 53 employees and referred 5 staff for further check-up and management. The workplace diabetic retinopathy screening program was inaugurated by Dr A Giridhar, Trustee, SSM ERF.



4. In the multispecialty screening "Medipress 2016" organized on 7<sup>th</sup> August 80 people were screened with different eye ailments. The participants include public, journalists and their dependents.



5. In October 2016, the leading newspaper "The Hindu" came forward to collaborate with Giridhar Eye Institute and SSM Eye Research Foundation for screening children in lower primary schools – aided, un-aided, CBSE, etc. 17 schools were covered in two months' time and 5293 students were screened in Ernakual District. 1115 students were identified with visual abnormalities and school authorities were informed of the same for further action.

6. On the occasion of World Sight Day 2016, SSM trust and its parent unit Giridhar Eye Institute jointly adopted Chellanam Grama Panchayat, one of the backward local bodies in Ernakulam with a population of 40,000 residents, for providing ophthalmic treatment to Below Poverty Line (BPL) residents free of cost for a period of one year from October 2016. Chellanam has been considered as one of the most backward local body in Ernakulam district in terms of socio economic status and health care facility. Regular camps for awareness and diagnosis would be conducted in the wards and schools in the panchayat area every month. Those who are certified as eligible for treatment (BPL) by the panchayat authorities would benefit by this scheme.

It is the first of its kind project in Kerala and the special features of this project are given below.

- This project will cover entire population of Chellanam (40000 approximately) in the sense of eye screening and provide free ophthalmic treatment to more than 3500 BPL families.
- Regular eye screening programs and awareness sessions will be conducted ward wise with the support of concerned ward member.
- Every primary school will be screened as part of this project.
- Panchayath members are authorized to write referral letter for the BPL people from their area to avail free treatment.



On 23<sup>rd</sup> October 2016 Kochi MLA Shri K J Maxi inaugurated the project and so far 25 surgeries, three intra vitreal injections and 33 investigation procedures were completed under this project.
